Your Will can help make your wishes clear to the loved ones you leave behind and makes it easy to ensure the people, and causes, you care for most are provided for.

For something that can leave such a big imprint, the actual process of writing a Will can be surprisingly easy. Just follow these four simple steps:

- Make a list of all your assets such as your home, savings and car, and your liabilities such as debts or mortgages.
- Make a list of your beneficiaries your family, your loved ones, and, if you choose, Dogs Trust too.
- Appoint an executor who will be responsible for your Will and carrying out your wishes. This can be a trusted friend or relation, or a solicitor.
- Meet your solicitor who will write your Will, and ensure it is stored in a safe place.

And remember, you can change your mind at any time and revise your Will at different stages of your life.
